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## 1. BEFORE DELIVERY CHECKLIST

Consider asking family members or hospital staff to assist you with any/all of these items.

	1. <a href="#">Contact a professional photographer</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• NILMDTS</li> <li>• Have someone other than the parents call if possible to let them know the circumstances and potential time frame</li> </ul>
	2. <a href="#">Contact local funeral homes</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Discuss finances</li> <li>• Cremation vs. burial</li> <li>• Financial assistance is available for those who qualify. See our FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE section for more details</li> </ul>
	3. <a href="#">Make a decision about having an autopsy, genetic testing, etc.</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Read SLF resources</li> <li>• Determine costs covered by the hospital</li> <li>• Discuss with your providers</li> <li>• Request to speak with the pathologist if you have any questions</li> <li>• Sending your placenta for testing can be done with or without an autopsy</li> <li>• An autopsy may help you find answers if having children after your loss is something that may be an option</li> </ul>
	4. <a href="#">Complete the Application for a Florida Certificate of Birth Resulting in Stillbirth</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Request that the hospital social worker help you complete the form if you need assistance.</li> <li>• Complete this form so you have it. You can make the decision to mail it in at a later time.</li> </ul>
	5. <a href="#">Make a decision about organ donation</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Decide if organ donation is an option and if this is something you and your family would like to consider.</li> </ul>

## 2. AFTER DELIVERY CHECKLIST

Consider asking family members or hospital staff to assist you with any/all of these items.

	1. <a href="#">Make memories with your baby</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Utilize this precious and limited time with your beautiful baby/babies.</li> </ul>
	2. <a href="#">Reach out to your professional photographer ASAP</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ask for whatever pictures you would like</li> <li>Consider taking family pictures with grandparents, living children, etc.</li> </ul>
	3. <a href="#">Contact the funeral home you selected to finalize arrangements</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If you decide on an autopsy, discuss this with your funeral director. A viewing should still be an option.</li> </ul>
	4. <a href="#">Decide how you would like to address your milk production</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Donate milk</li> <li>Save some milk to make jewelry</li> <li>Cabocreme – to help with ending milk production</li> </ul>
	5. Ask someone to create a meal train for when you return home from the hospital	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><a href="http://www.mealtrain.com">www.mealtrain.com</a></li> </ul>

### 3. MAKING MEMORIES WITH YOUR BABY AT THE HOSPITAL

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*Below you will find a list of some of the things other families have done with their baby(ies) during their hospital stay. If you are lacking resources, please consider asking the hospital staff for donated items or asking a family member or friend to make a trip to the store to purchase items for you. Most importantly, **take your time when making decisions** and **be kind to yourself**.*

- Name your baby
- Hold and touch your baby
- Kiss and hug your baby
- Request skin to skin contact after your baby is born
- Let family and friends hold and meet your baby
- Ask hospital staff for weight/height/head circumference measurements
- Ask hospital staff to fill out a crib card
- Ask hospital staff for name bands for your baby
- Handprint/footprint cards (have multiple made if possible)
- Hand/foot molds (Crayola model magic works well)
- Lock of hair keepsake
- Bathe your baby (ask for assistance if needed)
- Take photos of labor/delivery/your baby (every part of their body)
- Request professional photographs
- Take videos
- Journal (in writing/videos)
- Religious rituals (ex: baptism, etc.), ask for the hospital Chaplain
- Watch sports games on television with your baby
- Play music
- Read books
- Dress your baby
- Make a memory box or a memory book

## 4. PHOTOGRAPHY

Pictures and videos are precious memories you will have with your baby. We understand that during the grieving process this may feel very heavy on your heart. Even if you do not want to take photos or videos at this moment in time, please ask the hospital staff to do this for you.



## 5. FLORIDA CERTIFICATE OF BIRTH RESULTING IN STILLBIRTH

If your baby passes away before birth, you sadly will not receive a birth certificate. However, the State of Florida offers a Certificate of Birth Resulting in Stillbirth. Please note that to be eligible for a Florida Certificate of Birth Resulting in Stillbirth, **gestation must be 20 weeks' or more, and there must be a fetal death record on file.**

Stillbirth certificates must be issued first to the parents, a legal representative, or by court order. After the first issuance, the record becomes public and any applicant may apply.

**Make sure you request a copy of the fetal death certificate before you leave the hospital.**



The form is titled "APPLICATION FOR FLORIDA CERTIFICATE OF BIRTH RESULTING IN STILLBIRTH" and is issued by the State of Florida, Department of Health, Office of Vital Statistics. It includes sections for:
 

- SECTION A - TYPE OF BIRTH:** Fields for Full-Birth Details (Stillborn, Fetal Death), Date of Event, Mother's Name, and Father's Name.
- SECTION B - FEE & PAYMENT:** Fields for Certificate of Birth Resulting in Stillbirth (\$50), Additional Copies (\$10), Birth Order (\$10), and Fetal Death Certificate (\$10).
- SECTION C - APPLICANT/ISSUING INFORMATION:** Fields for Applicant Name, Type of Applicant, and Issuance Information.

 The form also includes checkboxes for "I hereby certify that the information furnished is true and correct" and "I hereby certify that the information furnished is true and correct" for the applicant and the issuing authority, respectively. There are "Print" and "Clear Form" buttons at the bottom right.

## 6. FINDING ANSWERS/TESTING OPTIONS

We understand the thought of finding out why your baby has passed away can be overwhelming. Since many of the tests are time sensitive, we believe in giving you the best resources as soon as possible so it can help you to make a decision.

- We gently encourage families to request that their placenta be sent away for testing (different than an autopsy).
- If you are struggling with making a decision regarding an autopsy, you can always request to speak with the pathologist who would perform the exam.
- We also encourage a family member to reach out to your insurance for you to discuss coverage.
